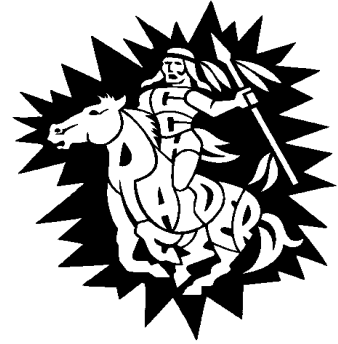

E. Health and Welfare Services

1. Approval of a contract with the Albany City School District to provide health and welfare services to eighty-six (86) South Colonie resident students attending: The Academy of the Holy Names Lower & Middle, Albany Academy for Boys, Albany Academy for Girls, Bishop Maginn, Blessed Sacrament, Holy Cross, and St. Catherine of Siena Schools located in the Albany City School District. The rate per student is \$655.35. The total cost of this contract shall be \$56,360.10 for the 2008-09 school year.

F. Agreements

1. Agreement between Joan Martelle (Physical Therapist) and South Colonie Central Schools to provide physical therapy services to two (2) students at the rate of \$55.00 per 30-minute session twice a week as set forth in the student's 2009-10 IEP. The fee includes preparation time, direct service, and completion of progress notes. Session notes will be completed and submitted each quarter along with a quarterly progress summary. This agreement will be in effect for the Summer Session 2009 and the 2009-10 school year.
2. Contract with Northeast Associates in Rehabilitation, LLC, 1721 Central Avenue, Albany NY 12205, for services to South Colonie Schools to provide staff (Job Coaches) to work at employment sites with students during the school day. Job Coaches will be responsible for providing orientation to work tasks, developing and implementing strategies for completion of work tasks, monitoring students' behavior, and generally assisting students in being competent workers. Northeast Associates will submit billing to South Colonie at the end of each month. Rate to be billed is \$31 per hour for all Job Coaches and budgeted personnel to a maximum total cost for the school year of \$125,400. No billing will be done for snow days or other student absences. The contract year will be July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010.
3. A contract with The Center for Disability Services, Inc. to provide educational services during July and August 2009 for two (2) South Colonie resident students at a cost of \$3,211.00 per month per student pending final STAC/SEC approval. Partial month shall be paid on a pro-rated basis of \$1,070.33 per week.

H. Summer Work Hours

1. **Psychological Services:**
Up to 80 work days during the summer of 2009 will be scheduled to be shared by all school psychologists to meet special education issues that occur during the summer and to assess new students entering the District.
2. **Departmental Work:**
Thirty (30) hours during the summer of 2009 for each high school department coordinator and chairperson for summer work as needed.
3. **Guidance Department:**
High School counselors will work July 6, 7, and 8, 2009 (8 hours per day) and tentatively August 21 through 27, 2009 (7 hours per day). Seven counselors will work 59 hours each for a total of 413 hours. One counselor will work every day, July 9 through August 19, two (2) hours per day (9 to 11 a.m.). In addition, 45 hours will be held in reserve to be assigned as needed by the building principal to address any issues that might interfere with the orderly opening of the high school.

Lisha Kill counselors (2) will work July 6, 7, and 8, 2009 (7 hours per day) and August 18 through 22, 2009 (7 hours per day). Two counselors will work 56 hours each for a total of 112 hours. Sand Creek counselors (2) will work July 6 through 10, 2009 (7 hours per day). Two counselors will work 35 hours each for a total of 70 hours. In addition, 12 hours will be held in reserve to be assigned as needed by the building principal to address any issues that might interfere with the orderly opening of the middle schools.

WHEAREAS, it is the plan of a number of PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS, other BOCES organizations, and the Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES (the "BOCES") during the 2009-10 school year to bid jointly for the purchase of various types of computers and technology commodities (the "Commodities"); and

WHEREAS, the South Colonie Central School District ("the School District") is desirous of participating in the joint bidding of the Commodities, as authorized by General Municipal Law, Article 5-G; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has received and reviewed the Cooperative Bid Procedures ("the Procedures") governing its rights and responsibilities should it elect to participate in the joint bidding of the Commodities; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby appoints the Superintendent, or designee, to represent it in all matters related above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in accordance with the Cooperative Bid Procedures, the Board of Education agrees to award bid item purchases according to the recommendations of the BOCES if such award is in the best interest of the school district.
