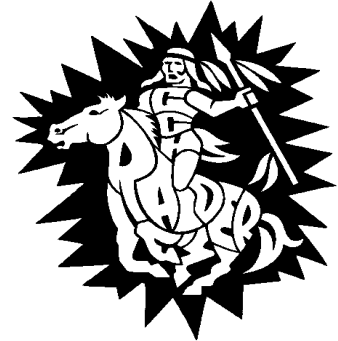

**G. Summer Work Hours****1. Psychological Services:**

Up to 80 work days during the summer of 2011 will be scheduled to be shared by all school psychologists to meet special education issues that occur during the summer and to assess new students entering the District.

2. **Departmental Work:**  
Thirty (30) hours during the summer of 2011 for each high school department coordinator and chairperson for summer work as needed.
3. **Guidance Department:**  
High School counselors will work July 5, 6, and 7, 2011 (8 hours per day) and August 22 through 26, 2011 (7 hours per day). Six counselors will work 59 hours each for a total of 354 hours. For summer coverage, one counselor will work every day, July 8 through August 18, two (2) hours per day (9 to 11 a.m.) for a total of 60 hours. In addition, up to 45 hours will be held in reserve to be assigned as needed by the building principal to address any issues that might interfere with the orderly opening of the high school.

Lisha Kill counselors (2) will work July 5 thru 7, 2011 (7 hours per day) and August 22 thru 26, 2011 (7 hours per day). Two counselors will work 56 hours each for a total of 112 hours. Sand Creek counselors (2) will work July 5 thru 8 and 11, 2011 (7 hours per day). Two counselors will work 35 hours each for a total of 70 hours. In addition, up to 12 hours will be held in reserve to be assigned as needed by the building principal to address any issues that might interfere with the orderly opening of the middle schools.

#### **H. Transportation Contracts**

1. A negotiated contract with Chalet Services Inc. for transportation to and from the Healy House at a cost of \$75.00 per diem. Transportation will begin Wednesday, June 22, 2011, and end Friday, June 24, 2011. The total cost of the contract shall be \$225.00.
2. A 30-day emergency contract with Chalet Services Inc. for transportation to and from the Healy House at a cost of \$75.00 per diem. Transportation begins Monday, May 23, 2011 and ends Tuesday, June 21, 2011. The total cost of this contract shall be \$1,575.00.
