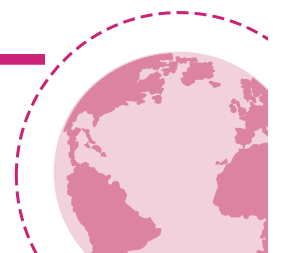

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

ENGLISH

Honors courses are available in grades 9-10. Advanced Placement courses begin in grade 11 with AP Language and Composition. Students may further their AP coursework as seniors with AP Literature and Composition or choose to take classes in conjunction with SUNY-Albany and Hudson Valley Community College for college credit.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Cooperative college credit courses in French and Spanish are available through SUNY-Albany. Introductory college classes in Italian are also available to students in conjunction with Hudson Valley Community College.

MATHEMATICS

Advanced Placement courses are available in Calculus AB and Calculus BC. Pre-Calculus and Elementary Statistics are offered for college credit through SUNY-Albany. Student may also independently prepare and register to take College Level Examination Program (CLEP) Exams to earn college credit in College Algebra, College Mathematics, Pre-Calculus or Calculus.

SCIENCE

Advanced Placement courses are available in biology, chemistry and physics.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Advanced Placement courses are offered in World History, U.S. History and Western European History. In addition, college credit is offered in Sociology, Psychology and Microeconomics following successful completion of the Hudson Valley Community College courses taught at CCHS.

TECHNOLOGY, ART, MUSIC, BUSINESS

Several classes are available in conjunction with HVCC and SUNY Adirondack. These include Architecture and Engineering, CISCO I and II, Automotive courses, Survey of Art History, Graphic Arts I and II and Digital Photography. PLTW classes are also offered through RIT. These classes include Design and Drawing for Production, Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronics, Civil Engineering and Architecture and Computer Integrated Manufacturing.

Note: Curricula in general engineering and bio-medical engineering are offered through the nationally recognized pre-engineering program, Project Lead the Way.
