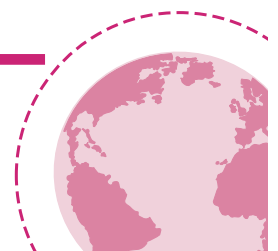

### ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

#### ENGLISH

Advanced Placement courses are available to seniors in literature and composition and language and composition. In addition, students may take classes in English in conjunction with SUNY at Albany and Hudson Valley Community College.

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Cooperative college credit courses in French and Spanish are available through SUNY Albany. Introductory college classes in Japanese and Italian are also available to students in conjunction with Hudson Valley Community College.

#### MATHEMATICS

An Advanced Placement course is available in calculus. In addition, computer programming courses are offered in conjunction with HVCC.

#### SCIENCE

Advanced Placement courses are available in biology, chemistry and physics.

#### SOCIAL STUDIES

Advanced Placement courses are offered in American History and Western European History. In addition, college credit is offered in sociology and psychology following successful completion of the College Level Examination Program or completion of the Hudson Valley Community College courses taught at CCHS. College credit in macroeconomics is available through HVCC.

#### TECHNOLOGY, ART, MUSIC, BUSINESS

Several classes are available to students in conjunction with HVCC. These include Computer Assisted Design, Electronic Publishing, Web Page Design, Music Appreciation, Accounting and Art History. A Curriculum Instruction course is offered through the College of Saint Rose.

*Note: Curricula in general engineering and bio-medical engineering are offered through the nationally recognized pre-engineering program Project Lead the Way.*
