

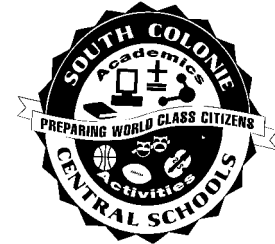

Approval of an Agreement with Elizabeth Klotz, 658 Stark Terrace, Ballston Spa, NY 12020 to provide transition consultant services for approximately 3.5 days per week for the time period of September 6, 2018 through June 26, 2019 at a rate of \$565.00 per day, not to exceed \$71,190.00 for the school year.
2. Approval of an agreement with CDB Connections, 673 Columbia Turnpike, East Greenbush, NY 12061 to provide Special Education and/or related services for the Summer 2018 and the 2018-2019 school year. The rate structure for Special Education, Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Music Therapy, and Social Work Services shall be \$55.00 per half hour (individual sessions) and \$35.00 per half hour, per child, for group sessions (of 2-5 children). Supplemental and triennial review evaluations for the above services will be billed at \$300.00 per evaluation. A rate add-on of \$25.00 per service for any services delivered at locations which are outside a 15 mile radius of the satellite offices.
3. Approval of an agreement with Building Better Futures, LLC, 26 Fairway Court, Voorheesville, NY 12186 to provide coaching, skill building and project management reports for reducing challenging behaviors in students. WHEREAS, the District has adopted, reviewed and evaluated instructional resources for Reading and recommended the Wilson Language Training Corp. Foundations Classroom Sets Level K to the Board of Education as the product that will best meet the pedagogical needs of the District; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of the Wilson Language Training Corp. Foundations Textbooks and Curriculum Materials is desired for use in Grade K instruction; and

WHEREAS, no other instructional materials provide substantially equivalent or similar benefits to that provided by the Wilson Language Training Corp. Foundations Classroom Sets; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the benefits received from the Foundations Classroom Sets, the cost of said instructional materials is reasonable in comparison to other instruction and evaluation materials in the marketplace for Reading; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 103 of the General Municipal Law, the governing board may approve such sole source procurement without competitive bidding when the possibility of competition does not exist for the product or service; and

WHEREAS, the South Colonie Central School District desires to procure the Wilson Language Training Corp. Foundations Classroom Sets for Grade K instruction based on the attached proposal from Wilson Language Training Corp., which is the sole source vendor for this product, for an initial investment of \$28,063.50 to be funded from the 2017-2018 General Fund Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT:

RESOLVED that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Superintendent and authorizes the procurement of the Wilson Language Training Corp. Foundations Classroom Sets for Grade K instruction for a total sum of \$28,063.50 and authorizes the purchase as a Sole Source Procurement; and
