4. <u>SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE</u>

Dr. Perry wanted to let everyone know that the NYS Board of Regents announced their Blue Ribbon Commission recommended potential changes to the graduation requirements, with the goal of giving students more pathways to earning a diploma. The potential changes may include the elimination of the three current type of diplomas (Regents diploma, Regents diploma with Advanced Designation, and the local diploma) and to replace the three diploma types with one diploma, with the option to add seals and endorsements. This has not been approved yet and will not affect students this year. Our second bi-annual equity report card is almost complete. We will share this out with our DEI Committee at the next meeting and will share out to the public towards the end of November. Beginning December 1, 2023, all students will enjoy the benefit of free meals at school. Congratulations to our senior student athletes who were recognized at the Fall Signing Day today. Students and families gathered to celebrate the students as they signed their National Letter of Intent to play.
